7. Discuss the significance of geopolitics of India in Indian Ocean with the response from the bordering countries with examples. 60

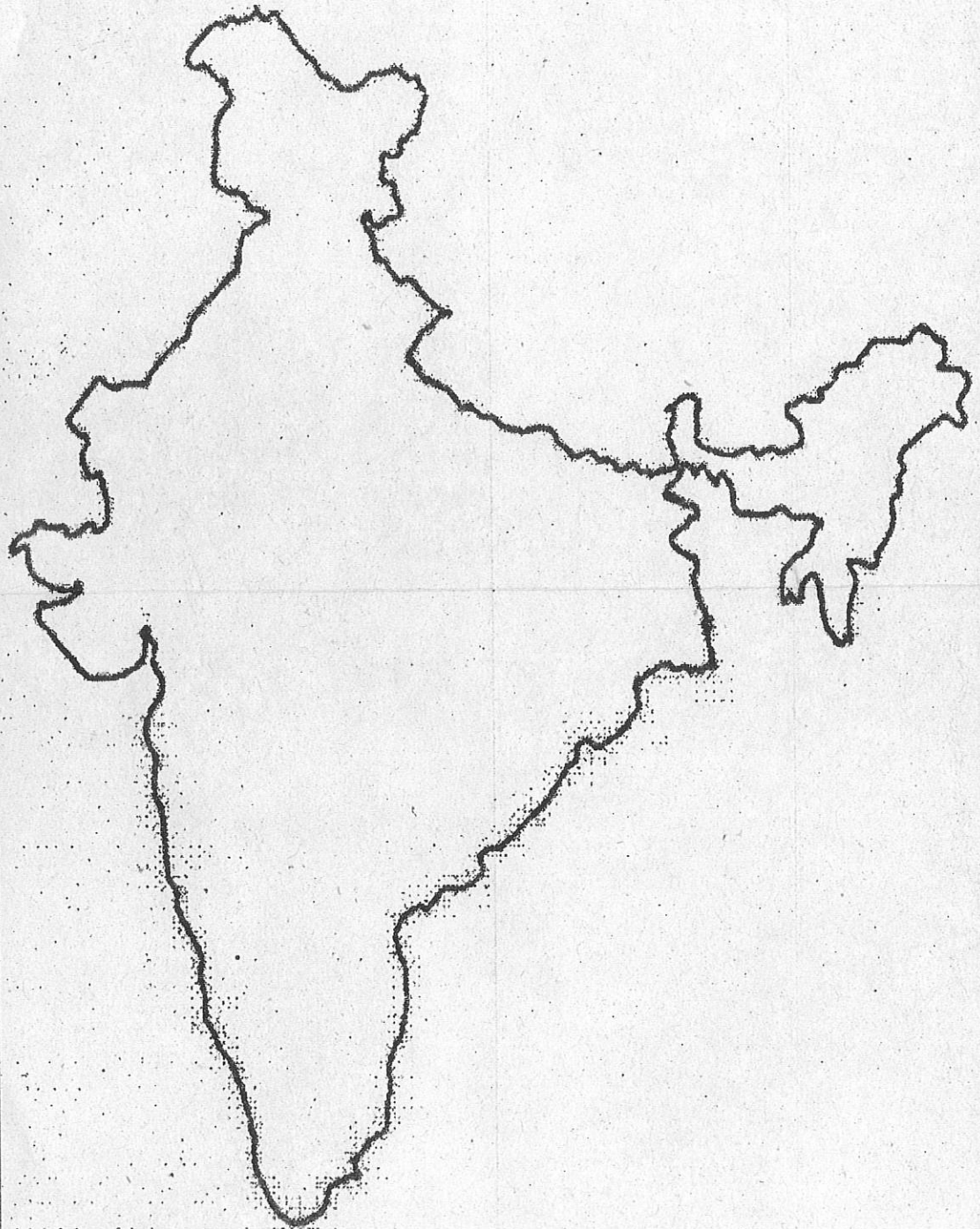
